Co-operative Councils' Innovation Network members believe that the unprecedented challenges facing the public sector and local communities mean that traditional models of top down governanceand economic growth are no longer fit for purpose.

We agree that we urgently need to create a new approach, and that the founding traditions of the co-operative movement collective action and co-operation, empowerment and enterprise - offer a foundation for fresh and innovative solutions which can bebuilt on to tackle the challenges of today.

In acknowledging that Councils are not in themselves registered co-operatives, we andour members have developed principles thathave grown from those of the International Co-operative Alliance and are relevant within the context of local government.

The icons should be used to demonstrate how Co-operative Councils are putting our co-operative principles into practice, demonstrating the 'cooperative difference' in the work that they are doing. We will strengthen the co-operative partnership between citizens, communities, enterprises and Councils, based on a shared sense of responsibility for wellbeing and mutual benefit.



Democratic Engagement

We will support the active engagement of the full range of residentsin decision making and priority setting.



Co-production

We will develop systems that enable citizens to be equal partners in designing and commissioning public services and in determining the use of public resources.



Enterprise and social economy

We will promote community-based approaches to economic development that focus on supporting the creation of jobs, social enterprises and other businesses and providing an environment forco-operative and mutual enterprises to thrive.









Maximising social value

We will support the development of a framework and criteria for social value, giving substance to the concept and supporting Councils with the tools to ensure better local socialand economic outcomes.



Community leadership and anew role for councillors

We will explore ways for councils to act as a platform for helping the community to contribute to local outcomes, and to re-think therole of councillors as community connectors, brokers and leaders.



New models of meeting priority needs

In exploring new ways of meeting the priority needs of our communities we will encourage models, such as co-operatives andmutuals, which give greater influence and voice to staff and users. in designing and commissioning public services and in determining the use of public resources.



Innovation

We will embrace innovation in how we work with local communities to drive positive change.











Learning

We will capture and 'expand' the experience and learningfrom individual projects and approaches in order to encourage broader application of co-operative principles within individual member Councils and across the Network.

As a membership organisation we will make this statement of our principles operational by:

- Co-operation among members: Our members work together tohelp each other implement our values, sharing experiences andlearning.
- Openness of membership: Full, Associate and Affiliate Membership is open to any qualifying Council, organisation orindividual who shares our values and is committed to putting them into action.
 - Co-production of the Network's work: Members help shape the Network's work programme and the content of events andwritten products.
- Action-focused: The network is a vehicle for helping councilstranslate co-operative values and principles into policy and practice.
- Membership-based: The network is majority funded by modest membership subscriptions from its member Councils, Associatesand Affiliates.
- Non-party-political: Members share the belief that working co-operatively within and across communities holds the key totackling today's challenges.


