# How can I use the pipeline development tool?

- Diagnostic: identifying existing infrastructure & development gaps
- Strategic: when & where to invest capacity and resources
- Funding: leveraging internal & external funding



#### 1. Diagnostic

 The purpose of this phase is to understanding the baseline: What data is out there? What is the existing democratic business infrastructure? Which organisations and possible partners can we identify?



# Diagnostic breakout activity

Start to develop a map for your local authority / area - What business support programmes exist? Which co-ops are there? Which institutions (business, statutory) might enable connections?



### 2. Strategic

 Based on the outputs from the diagnostic assessment, the purpose of this phase is to analyse gaps in the current system for democratic business and cultural development, and prioritise what areas of investment would create maximum impact for the pipeline?

#### 3. Funding

 Based on our identified investment priorities, what funding is available to support these options (e.g. micro grants to existing programmes)
